

Dear Parent / Carer,

Welcome back and a Happy New Year to everyone!

Following my decision to retire, the school governors have been putting much time and thought into planning my replacement. They fully intend that the leadership of the school will be secure and in good hands next September in order that all the improvements we have made will continue strongly. They are keen to keep you well-informed about the changes and you will receive a letter from the Chair of Governors early next week outlining the way forward for the school.

You may remember that at this time last year we wrote about strategies to help children become not only strong readers but also keen readers for pleasure! Many of you took part in our questionnaire which really helped us understand the children's reading habits outside school. We made a number of refinements to our strategies in school and this year we are in the process of setting up a new system called 'Accelerated Reader'. This will initially be introduced to Years 3 and 4 and then rolled out to Years 5 and 6. The programme links online learning and quizzes with real books in our library – it will really excite the children! It will take a little time to set up but it should be up and running by half-term. Of course nothing will replace the joy of reading for pleasure with someone at home and we would encourage you to continue this all the way through school.

As this term gets underway, we are starting a push on handwriting and spelling in line with the new national curriculum. As well as all the work in Literacy and Numeracy, there are exciting projects planned that cover other areas of the curriculum and give opportunities for children to apply their literacy and numeracy skills. Each Year group's newsletter entry will give a bit more detail but below is a summary of some of the exciting opportunities ahead:

Safe Use of The Internet

All the children are taught in school about safe use of the internet. Our work in ICT lessons includes introducing them to *edmodo.com* which is a safe educational social platform on which children can learn how to interact safely online. We have been made aware that some children are using an online social website called Omegle, at home. We think that children are unwise to use this site. A quick search throws up the following quote about Omegle:

"Omegle is a free online-chat website that allows users to communicate with strangers without registering. The service randomly pairs users in one-on-one chat sessions where they chat anonymously using the handles "You" and "Stranger"."

We are very concerned about the unregulated and unmonitored nature of this website – and that the prime purpose seems to be to encourage communication with strangers! We have discussed it with children in assembly and wish to draw your attention to the potential dangers using Omegle and similar websites.

Year 4 News

The Year 4s have made an enthusiastic start to 2014 with a short 'Cats vs.Dogs' project in Literacy – it's been great to see the number of children prepared to do extra work and research in their own time to help their team along!

This term, we have introduced a new two-week timetable in Year 4. This enables us to spend more time on core skills in Maths and Literacy, without affecting children's access to other subjects. A copy of the timetable is attached. Please note that classes 4R and 4H will need their PE kits on Friday and 4P will need them on Monday. Games will continue to be on Thursday.

In Literacy, we will be concentrating on reading and writing non-fiction texts about dragons and developing independent research skills. This will be followed by a unit of work on Science-fiction stories. We are also studying China and its cultural traditions in Geography and Art, and Solids, liquids and gases in Science. Library trips or reading at home to support these studies is always encouraged!

The deadline for making a decision about whether or not your child takes part in the Whitwell Hall trip has passed. Full payment is required by 14th February, please.

Shortly after half-term we would really like to see you at a Celebration Assembly when the children can share their learning with you and show off some of their best work. We will confirm the date and time shortly.
